Introduction

The Study

In May 2019, the City of Bunbury administered a MARKYT[®] Community Scorecard to evaluate community priorities and measure the Council's performance against key indicators in the Strategic Community Plan.

Scorecards invitations were sent to 4,000 randomly selected households (2,000 by mail and 2,000 by email).


469 randomly selected residents completed a scorecard reducing the sampling error to $\pm 4.5\%$ at the 95% confidence interval.

The City provided supporting promotions through its communication channels. A further 191 residents, 146 out-of-area ratepayers or visitors and 38 council-affiliated respondents participated bringing the total to **844 respondents**. As analysis of results showed significant differences between these groups, the main body of this report presents responses from the random sample of residents only.

The final dataset was weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile.

Data has been analysed using SPSS. Where sub-totals add to $\pm 1\%$ of the parts, this is due to rounding errors to zero decimal places.




How to read the MARKYT \bigotimes Benchmark Matrix TM

This line represents Council's average performance for all individual measure. As it represents the average, around half of the service areas will be placed above the line, and around half will be positioned below the line.





In the City of Bunbury's Community Trends Window, detailed overleaf, most services are ideally located in Window 1. These are higher performing areas that continue to improve.

The stand out performers are festivals, events, art and cultural activities, fortnightly rubbish collections, litter collection, and playgrounds, parks and reserves.

Window 2 includes lower performing areas that are improving. Celebrate progress and continue to work on areas including airport facilities and services as well as planning and building approvals.

There is opportunity to arrest marginal declines in five areas being development of the City Centre, economic development and tourism, leadership, advocacy and lobbying, and access to services and facilities for people with disabilities.



Perceived strengths include organic waste, recycling and verge-side rubbish collections, library services and the South West Sports Centre.


Moving forward, the community would like Council to prioritise developing the Bunbury City Centre and economic development (window G).

Community Action Plan Bunbury City Centre

Challenges | identified by the community

Community Voices

"Bring life back to the city centre."

"Developing vibrancy in the city centre. Do rents need to be lowered to attract business? So many vacant shop spaces. Bring the train to the city centre is another way to attract people to the city centre. What ever it takes! It's sad to see."

"Revitalising the CBD - too many buildings are vacant and business is moving out of the area. Bring back the vitality, encourage people to come to the city centre, building owners to be more open to negotiating rents/increases so tenant stays longer."

"The CBD is becoming an empty town. Eaton shopping is taking over Bunbury which is a little embarrassing really. Town needs a big uplift and shopping centres need to become more 'lively' with bars, better eating etc. Paid and even free parking with requirement for a ticket needs reviewing too."

"The CBD. Our city centre lacks vibrancy, freshness and innovation. We need a heart to our city, an exciting place for people to visit and shop in, a place that provides experiences and has soul."

"Overall the City of Bunbury is a fantastic place to live and particularly in the last 5-7 years the variety of places to go at night has improved but we are still left with far too many empty premises which makes the town look like it's dying. Yet we are still allowing development of new premises. Let's get what's here filled first, incentivise new business to settle in Bunbury."

"Making owners of inner-city building improve their exterior facades and reduce their rents to encourage new business."

"Perhaps more encouragement to attract businesses to CBD. So many empty premises!"

"Develop the city centre, pedestrian only Victoria Street. Affordable rates for small business owners."



- Loss of vibrancy in the City Centre.
- Empty premises.
- Unkempt shopfronts.
- High rental costs causing businesses to move elsewhere.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. More incentives to encourage local businesses to the area.
- 2. Encourage landlords to reduce rents or implement penalties for empty premises.
- 3. Shop owners to beautify facades.
- 4. Remove paid parking.
- 5. Bring train line directly into the CBD and improve public transport options.
- 6. Consider Victoria Street as a pedestrian mall.

Community Action Plan Economic development

Challenges | identified by the community

- Not enough done to attract visitors and tourists to Bunbury.
- Still seen as a drive-by City.
- Struggling businesses.
- Limited economic growth and employment opportunities.
- Lack of vibrancy in the CBD.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Boost tourism promotion.
- 2. Improve tourist facilities.
- 3. Identify a unique selling point for Bunbury that differs from other areas in the South West.
- 4. Assist businesses in the City Centre to boost its vibrancy and unique character.
- 5. Attract more investment and new industry.
- 6. Improve train and port infrastructure.

Community Voices

"Something that is unique for Bunbury for tourism to focus on. Maybe more cruise ships!"

"Focus on increasing tourism. It will help to resolve the dead centre of town. We need people to spend money in our local businesses every day of the week. Perhaps businesses will even open afternoon on Saturdays!"

"Encouraging more visitors to the City. Assisting small business to leverage visitors spend habits. Focus on CBD businesses to assist in cash flow issues. Encourage local events and street type festivals into the CBD and to create a vibrant environment (fun)."

"Tourism. Bringing in people from the country. People bypass Bunbury and head to Busselton and Margaret River because they offer more, better beaches, parks and tourist access. Tourists cannot even park in town centre because of restrictions, paid parking."

"Attracting tourists and providing great outdoor spaces that the locals can use as well as tourists. THINK BIG for a change: A beach front pool at Rocky Point, great landscaping/ multiple playgrounds/ excellent walk and bike trails along the beach and the inlet (such as Esperance, Geraldton and Mandurah have done). More bike paths (e.g. all the way to Busselton) to attract cycle tourism."

"Tourism to create jobs for people."

"Economic Development - it's great living here but not much opportunity for employment, reasonable training (\$\$) and it seems more and more empty shops / retail around Bunbury."

"Encouraging/supporting private investment. Lobbying for more state and federal funding, we have been left behind in comparison to other regional areas like Busselton and Albany. Like a better train network and the station located in Bunbury. Modern approach to the inner city development and bars/ restaurants."

"Business Development particularly in the CBD."

"Increasing business activity and tourism promotion."



Challenges | identified by the community

Community Voices

"Parks improvement. Beautification of public areas and parks."

"Maintenance of beaches, parks, recreation facilities to be improved."

"Playground and parks close to city centre to attract families into town rather than Eaton Fair or forum."

"Parks for children including playground equipment for younger children. The foreshore in town needs some shaded tables and chairs, bbqs, playground equipment for kids similar to Mandurah and Busselton's foreshore. Make it inviting for families to come into the city. The park near the Parade Hotel needs sheltered tables and chairs. The city of Bunbury needs to be made more family orientated to promote tourism etc."

"More effort done in improving the smaller playgrounds in suburbs."

"Maintenance and development of parks and reserves out of the city centre, including those that are an entry statement to visitors."

"The Collie River walkway and children's park is an eyesore and should be made far more attractive and inviting for tourists and local residents alike."

"Would like more shade sails on beach at Koombana Bay."

"More BBQ/picnic/shade and seating areas by the beach. Decent dog park."

"Maintenance of parks and reserves (rubbish and/or obsolete facilities). Better control of: illegal rubbish dumps, vandalism in parks and of dogs (and their owners!) in certain areas (although this has improved in recent times)."

"Make old depot into nature reserve. (i.e. original wetland) on Nuytsia Ave. Re-instate Nuytsia trees - systematically destroyed over time. Commit to massive planting of natives; Albany has undertaken 30,000 such plantings at "Yakamia" turtle precinct."



- Poor park maintenance across the City.
- Not enough facilities including shade, picnic tables, playgrounds, barbecues, etc.
- Unkempt open spaces at City entrances are uninviting for visitors.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Beautify and protect public open space.
- Improve the condition of local parks to encourage use by families and visitors.
- 3. Install more playgrounds and equipment.
- 4. Increase facilities including shade sails, picnic areas, barbecues etc.

Challenges | identified by the community

Community Voices

"More footpaths for elderly, people with disabilities and walkers, joggers etc."

"Better pedestrian access in the City. There are very few cross walks."

"More footpaths. Too many streets without any path. Example, McQueen Crescent in South Bunbury leads to a walkway to Big Swamp Playground, but there is no footpath to safely walk with children, prams etc., so road must be used to access walkway. Gibson St has a bus stop but no footpath for people to use to get to it. Unsafe."

> "Footpaths and cycleways - I hate seeing children/parents with prams having to use the road to walk their children to and from school. It's wrong! Cycleway is not a footpath. Street lighting."

"Dedicated footpaths, where dual use and generous roads are available for cyclists."

"Provision of more and suitable dual use paths at least 2m wide."

"Walkways and cycleways to continue to be developed. Continue paths on the same side to make it easier to walkaround."

"The cycle path network and how it connects. The connection between the Australind terminus and the CBD."

"More cycle paths and mountain bike trails within the City. Widen the entire length of Ocean Drive to allow safe cycling."

> "More cycleways for safe bike riding on main roads (e.g. Robinson Drive, Bussell Highway)."

"I do a lot of walking around the city myself and further out with my dog. Footpaths are not always well maintained, nor verges/parks well gardened. I have had to highlight poor gardening several times to the Council. I also personally collect an entire bag of rubbish every weekend along the same walk path (mostly fast food wrappers and cups)."



- · Limited footpath and cycleway connectivity.
- Unsafe for pedestrians, especially people with low mobility.
- Cycleways not wide enough.
- · Litter along footpaths.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Increase connectivity across the City and between suburbs.
- 2. Improve the condition of footpaths and remove litter.
- 3. Widen dual-use paths or provide dedicated paths for both walking and cycling.
- 4. Provide more opportunities for cycling safely.

Community Action Plan Parking

Challenges | identified by the community

Community Voices

- Despite recent improvements, paid parking is still seen to deter visitors to the City Centre.
- Affects local businesses.
- Not enough parking in recreational areas including Koombana Bay.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Remove ticket parking.
- 2. Provide more free parking in the CBD.
- 3. Increase parking in popular recreation spots.

"Take the parking meters out of the City centre. There is a population explosion in the northern and southern suburbs and very little reason for people to visit the city centre, when there are shopping centres closer to where they live. Parking meters deter people from bothering to visit the city centre."

"Free, non ticketed parking to encourage people into the town precinct."

"Eliminate paid street parking in CBD!!! Must attract more people into CBD."

"Remove parking meters to try to attract shoppers back into the CBD. Outside shopping centres do not have any parking restrictions hence most shoppers go elsewhere. It will show members of the public the Council is listening to them."

"Increase parking in the City Centre to three hours. This would help central business to compete with suburban shopping centres. It is not a good look for Bunbury to have so many empty shops."

"Remove the need to display a ticket within the CBD when the two hours are free anyway."

"The new development at Koombana Bay. Need better usage of parking area. We need parking spaces not an architecturally designed winding roadway. Bays, bays, bays for families so that they can park and bring the family for picnics and use of the facilities during the Summer."

"Congratulations on improvement to foreshore in Stirling Street but parking should be improved between boat ramp and Parade Hotel."



Community Action Plan Safety and security

Challenges | identified by the community

- Safety concerns in the CBD and suburban areas.
- Substance abuse and drug dealing.
- Negative reputation for the area.
- Crime.
- Anti-social behaviour.
- Hooning.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Identify strategies to assist in addressing and reducing crime.
- 2. Increase police presence across the City.
- 3. Install more street lighting.
- 4. Address drug dealing and usage.

Community Voices

"Strategies to reduce crime in identified risk areas. Strategy to respond to hoon-like driving."

"Security - Police on foot in CBD regularly and police on bicycles in suburbs. The more people see police in the community and interact with them, the more trust is built, making a safer community for all."

"More police presence in and around Bunbury city and the surrounding suburbs."

"One major focus, in my opinion, is the requirement of much needed lighting, both in built-up and non built-up areas, as it assists the community in feeling safe and may contribute to less inappropriate 'unsocial' behaviour of others."

"Security and lighting could do with an improvement (the local police force has a very large area to cover)."

"Removal of drug houses in the suburbs. It is quite obvious that some locations are used by people in the drug trade. It is concerning to see drugs being traded in public places."

"The Withers area control of drug gangs who are terrorizing law abiding citizens."

"Substance abuse and reputation for this that Bunbury has, needs to be addressed."

"Curb crime and drug usage."



Challenges | identified by the community

Community Voices

"Connectivity between Koombana, CBD and Back Beach to create a more vibrant hub."

"Better & innovative use of our major asset our water frontage. We need a fantastic new art gallery built on our waters edge."

"There are not many cities in the world that are surrounded by water yet we fail to take advantage of it. There continually fails to be any forward thinking in Council to allow and promote development of our city."

"We have amazing coastline and estuaries that lend themselves to better utilised public open spaces. More development of family friendly spaces to promote utilisation of the town centre and encourage Bunbury to be a tourist destination."

"Integrating the three waters across the city centre with waterfront development at each point. Especially the Back Beach and the inlet. Open east to west access across the city centre with lots of trees. Closing off parts of Victoria St at night and on weekends to promote inner city activities and social gatherings/functions."

> "Using our natural resources more like the ocean and inlet, better walk ways and cafe along Ocean Drive."

"Take care of our best asset, our waterways, especially our Back Beach! Please trim some of the trees and bushes to give us locals and our visitors better sight and openness of our beautiful beach!!"

"I would like to see very serious consideration for the building of the Back Beach pool concept. We need this for the people of Bunbury but also to draw tourists to Bunbury."

"Have a jetty like Busselton or better!...We love the redevelopment of our Koombana Bay. Just need more shade and seating."



 Not enough being done to promote and enhance the City's waterfront location.

 Lack of connectivity between key sites including Koombana Bay, the CBD and Back Beach.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Connect the City's main attractions.
- 2. Enhance and develop the waterfront assets, especially Back Beach.
- 3. Strive for innovative ideas and attractions.
- 4. Consider ocean pool.
- 5. More trees and shade along Koombana bay.



























Additional Priorities for Consideration

Community Action Plan (among opt-in residents) Sport and recreation

Challenges | identified by the community

- Not all sporting groups receive the same level of support
- Use of local sporting grounds and facilities is too expensive
- Facilities need upgrading; toilets / change rooms and other amenities are substandard
- Not enough indoor courts to accommodate local clubs or major events

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. More support for local clubs and venues, financial support should be spread more evenly between different organisations.
- 2. Facilities like club rooms, toilets, etc. should be upgraded. Either renovate or knock them down and build something more modern.
- 3. SWSC should be upgraded to accommodate local clubs and major events.

Challenges | identified by the community

- Not enough indoor courts, courts are not up to standard for things like basketball
- Not enough stadium seating around indoor courts
- Fixtures for local basketball are limited by lack of available courts
- Unable to host major events at SWSC due to inadequate facilities

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Build more indoor courts at SWSC that meet current standards for basketball
- 2. Improve seating around indoor courts
- 3. Develop SWSC into a regional hub for major sporting events

Community Voices

"Sporting facilities - in particular the South West Sports Centre"

"The indoor court area at the SWSC needs improving, stadium seating & more indoor courts are needed."

"Upgrade SW sports centre - more basketball courts and full size basketball courts"

"For the biggest regional centre in WA and with the increased popularity of basketball and other court based sports the swsc is too small. Lacks appropriate amounts of seating and only having 3 courts is ridiculous. A centre the size of bunbury should have double the amount it has now at least. This would facilitate more games both domestically and to have for carnival events."

"SWSC indoor court needs to be improved to meet: OH&S standards, currently the area is dangerous to spectators, players & officials FIBA basketball standards, more indoor courts are needed to meet current & latent demand for all indoor court sports. Bunbury Basketball Assoc. want to offer more leagues, operate during winter & host major basketball events. With the three existing 40 year courts, this can't be achieved. SWSC needs to be expanded to be the SW Regional indoor court facility. Bunbury needs this drawcard, so it can host major indoor court sport events & attract the Sports Tourism dollar. Please don't allow another LGA to have the SW regional indoor court facility. DSR Bunbury Wellington Sports Facilities Plan extract : 'SWSC has the highest potential to contribute to the economic growth of sports in the region, the facility's indoor sporting infrastructure should be viewed as a priority to cater for the attraction of major sporting events' SWSC is ranked first in the suggested hierarchy of provision. 'Regional level provision for state level competition." ***





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
