1.0 Organising Authority

The Bunbury Masters Carnival is the administrated and conducted by the Bunbury Basketball Association which is affiliated with Basketball WA.

2.0 Purpose

The Bunbury Masters Carnival, for both Men and Women, is held each year on the last weekend of January for the purpose of establishing and encouraging social engagement, stir up aging competitiveness and the rekindling of lasting friendship for an older demographic in the sport of basketball.

The carnival is set up as a short format of the game with quick games in a short period of time, to allow participation to play hard without over stressing the aging body. The carnival and centre, the South West Sports Centre is a smoke free environment and whilst Alcohol will be available to compliment socialising, strict enforcement of associated serving of alcohol under the restrictions of an occasional liquor licencing laws, will be enforced and responsible drinking will be expected.

3.0 Dates and Venue of Championship

The 2024 Bunbury Masters Carnival will be held on the following dates:

- Saturday 27th January 2024 (All Day)
- Subject to Nominations of teams, consideration will be given to expanding to Sunday or to other venues with in 20 minutes of the South West Sports Centre.
- Home venue will be South West Sports Centre and Bunbury PCYC potentially other centrally located venues, pending nomination numbers.

4.0 Age Groupings

The 2024 Bunbury Masters Carnival, subject to nominations may have the following age groupings:

- Men Over 35s (1988 or earlier) Over 45s (1978 or earlier)
- Women Over 30s (1993\ or earlier) Over 40s (1983 or earlier)
- If nomination team numbers do not allow for the specific older age group to engage in fixtured rounds, these teams will be included in the next younger age group. In this case, these teams at the end of the carnival will still be recognised in their registered age group regardless of the position they finish in the younger age group. (i.e. Highest finishing Over 45s team in the younger age group will be considered the highest finishing Over 45s team and received recognition as such)
- It is anticipated that older age groups will be included in future years as the carnival grows

5.0 Eligibility to Participate

Any organised team is eligible to enter a team in any of the age groupings in the 2024 Bunbury Masters Carnival.

It is preferred that teams represent a Basketball WA affiliated association however, nonaffiliated players/teams will pay an affiliation fee and be affiliated for the carnival. All participants must be affiliated during the carnival.

6.0 Nominations

Urgently required - Nomination of team names are to be nominated online prior to Friday 15th December 2023; Email your Team Name, Age Group & Men or Women's team to Carnival Coordinator: Rob Dempster, basketballcrazy1964@gmail.com

Player Nominations – Each player must be nominated online prior to Friday 12th January 2024 4.00pm. This will include playing for the BWA Affiliation Fee à \$3 per player BWA carnival fees.

- Each team will be ranked accordingly, after discussions between Carnival Coordinator, Fixturing Coordinator and each individual Team Contact. Information that will help rankings includes:
 - Knowing players who have had elite basketball careers including but not limited to NBL, SBL, State or WABL.
 - General fitness of players.
 - Current competitions the team may participate in.
 - Previous results in this and other masters carnivals.
- Bunbury Basketball Association's decision on acceptances and placement in pools is final.
- Bunbury Basketball Association reserves the right to limit nomination numbers according to known capacities of facilities, umpires or time restrictions.

7.0 Cost of Nominations

The 2024 nomination fee is \$35 per Player *(GST Included)*. There is an online nomination process of which the fee needs to be paid electronically using PlayHQ.

Affiliation fee for Basketball WA, each player will include a \$3 BWA fee when they individually register online in the early January leading up into the carnival.

There are no door fees to be charged for entry to the SWSC so you can come and go unchecked however, if players are participating in the after-carnival function, there is a \$5 food cover charge payable at the bar counter. It is difficult to supply food for family and friends so please allow the food to remain for players only.

The nomination fee is non-refundable once the nomination due date has elapsed.

8.0 Restrictions

Players may not change from one grade to another during the 2024 Bunbury Masters Carnival

9.0 Player Nominations

Each team may only select twelve (12) players for each game. Players must be nominated into teams prior to the weekend commencing.

10.0 Finals Participation

The winners of the carnival will be the teams finishing in first place for each age group for Men & Women.

Subject to team nominations, time, facilities availability, the Bunbury Basketball Association may decide to conduct grand finals for each age group (i.e. first verses second). This will be known prior to the carnival commencing. Should finals be conducted, players will be required to play a minimum of 40% of pool & crossover games to participate in the grand final.

11.0 Format of Pools

The formation of pools will be determined by a ranking of teams and the number of teams nominating and the court time available. There will be high, middle and low ranked teams will be placed in each individual pool 1, 2, 3 etc.

12.0 Format of Crossover Games (Example pending number of teams)

Cross Over Round – positioning teams (ranked 1-8 & 9-16) Semi-finals Round – positioning teams (ranked 1-4, 5-8, 9-12 & 13-16) Playoff Positions – (ranked 1-16 final placing)

13.0 Team Control

Since the Bunbury Basketball Association is a support of the South West "Choose Respect" campaign, each team nominated must name a coach and manager to be responsible for the players on and off the court. Nominations without full details supplied will not be accepted.

14.0 Referees

Referees will be supplied and be paid by the Bunbury Basketball Association. Given the social nature of the carnival, a minimum of one level 1 referee will be rostered to each pool and crossover game. This will also keep the cost of nominating a team to a minimum.

As a courtesy when one referee is on the court, it is anticipated that players will raise their hand or acknowledge their part, should the ball go out of court and being unsighted by the referee.

Should Grand Finals be played, two referees will be rostered.

15.0 Scoretable Officials

Each team must provide a competent Scoretable Official for each of its games, including Finals.

The administration of scoring using the scoreboard and the recording of the game is required by one person representing each team. Should a non-playing person not be available, substitution players or coach must sit the bench.

16.0 Fixtures

The compilation of pool fixtures will be the responsibility of Bunbury Basketball Association. Commencement time will be advised at the earliest date and time once nominations are completed. If need be some games maybe played in other venues or on Sunday to accommodate all fixtures.

17.0 Equipment

All scoring devices and time-clocks will be supplied by SWSC & Bunbury Basketball Association.

Teams will supply their own Basketballs.

18.0 Door Charges

The team Nomination Fee covers all personnel for entry.

19.0 Playing Rules

The 2024 Barr and Standley 7th Bunbury Masters Carnival will be conducted as per the FIBA Rulebook with the following modifications:

19.1 Game Timing

- 25 minute time slots comprising of:
- Warm-up Three (3) minutes
- First Half straight ten (10) minutes running clock from main clock.
- Half Time two (2) minutes
- Second Half straight ten (10) minutes running clock from the main clock,
- Time Outs one per half each team.
- Approx 5 minutes between games
- Shot Clocks will not be in use during the carnival.
- The Carnival Coordinator reserves the right to reduce the game timing should for whatever reason, games have been delayed during the day so that the carnival can meet centre opening hours
- **19.2 Premiership Points**

19.3 Drawn Games In (Womens) round robin games or (Mens) pool games, the result of a drawn game is to stand. Each team's score will continue to accumulate for an against.

In Crossover and Semi-final games. Each team will nominate a player to shoot five free-throws at the same end of the court with points added to the score to break the tie. Should the score remain a draw at the end of five free-throws, one shot will be taken alternatively by each player until someone misses their free-throw. Again, points will be added to the score.

In final play-off games - teams will play extra periods of three (3) minutes, end on end until the winner is determined. No

Time-out in each extra period. There will be one (1) minute intervals between each extra period

- 19.4 Ball SizeWomen's Age GroupsSize 6Men's Age GroupsSize 7
- 19.5 Forfeit Points If a team is not ready to play 3 minutes after the scheduled starting time a forfeit will be declared, with the result of 10-nil win to the opposition.
- 19.6 Fouls Per half: 5 personal fouls 5 team fouls
- 19.7 24 Second Device Not in use at the Bunbury Masters Carnival

19.8 Final Placing In the event of two or more teams being level on points for & against at the end of the qualifying games, position on the premiership table shall be on the basis of:

- a) Qualifying game head to head.
- b) If the teams are still level, points <u>percentage</u> in the games played between the teams involved in the tie will be used.
- c) If teams have drawn or not all played one another in the tie, overall percentage will be used.

19.9 Appeals/Protests

All appeals, or protests must be in writing and accompanied within 10 minutes of game conclusion.

Teams may only appeal at the conclusion of a game. Refusal to take the court during an active game will result in forfeit.

Protests must be lodged with Bunbury Basketball Association at the front desk. During this process, all Bunbury Basketball staff must be approached in a calm and respectful manner.

Bunbury Basketball Basketball Associations decisions are final.

19.10 Code of Conduct A "Code of and Officials will b

A "Code of Conduct" for players, parents and Officials will be adhered to for all teams in the Carnival. Teams will be responsible for the behaviour of their spectators.

Players, team officials and spectators not abiding by the Code or Policy will be asked to
